Can you feel a change in the air? Fall is just around the corner and our Elementary, Jr. and Sr. High School students have returned to school. Soon many college students will begin a new chapter in their life. A Newman Center chaplain sent the following suggestions to help our college bound parishioners stay connected to their faith:

Here are a few tips:

1. Help them find a Newman Center or local Catholic parish. Encourage them to stay active in their faith. If they are going to a public university, most likely there is a Newman Center somewhere on or nearby campus. If there isn't, try to find a local parish that they can join. Finding a community of fellow Catholics is important in college, as is keeping an active prayer life. Your college student will be making a lot of decisions about the future, and it is good to encourage them to have Christ as the center of their decisions.
2. Contact the Campus Minister prior to taking your student to college. If you can meet the Campus Director in person and tour the facility beforehand, that is even better. If time will not allow, at least introduce your college student and find out where the Newman Center is located and what it has to offer. It is also good to learn the location of where the Newman Center and Church are located from the dorm.
3. Encourage your student to get involved in the activities of the Newman Center or Parish. You will be surprised how many Catholic students attend these activities. It is a great way to form community and be with students who have the same beliefs. Together they can pray and discern the plans that God has for them

The Newman Center is ready to assist in the next stage of spiritual development for your college student. You can drive away with peace of mind knowing they are connected to a solid faith community.
