“Only conduct yourselves in a way worthy of the gospel of Christ.” Rom. 1:27a

We have to know where we came from in order to know who we are. So, with September 17th being the feast of St. Lambert here is your yearly reminder of the story of our patron saint:

St. Lambert was born in Maestricht, Netherlands around 633. His parents were nobility, and he was given a very religious education. Lambert received instruction from St. Theodardus, whom he succeeded in 670 as Bishop of Maestricht. After defending the interests of the reigning king he was forced to flee the city. Eventually he was able to return home.

St. Lambert was martyred due to his defense of marriage. Pepin of Heristal was the Mayor of the Palace of Austrasia. For many years he was happily married to his wife, who bore him two sons. Later he took another woman, Alpais, as his mistress. Lambert, like a modern day John the Baptist, went to Pepin’s court and admonished Pepin on his behavior. Alpais, afraid that Pepin would heed Lambert, appealed to her brother, Dodo, to help her. Dodo sought revenge, assassinating Lambert with a javelin through the heart while he was at the altar celebrating Mass.

In this time when the basic understanding of marriage is under attack in our society it is good to be reminded that, like St. Lambert, in taking a stand for the protection of the institution of marriage we are conducting ourselves in a way worthy of the Gospel of Christ.

Another matter to consider taking a stand on is the 2010 comprehensive health care reform law, the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA), which poses new risks to religious freedom and rights of conscience.

Cardinal DiNardo, chairman of the bishops Committee on Pro-Life Activities, objected to mandated coverage not only for surgical sterilization but also for “all FDA-approved birth control” (including the IUD, morning-after pills, and the abortion-inducing drug Ella) and for “education and counseling” to promote these among all “women of reproductive capacity.” Insurance plans will be required to cover these controversial practices without a co-pay from recipients. “The considerable cost of these practices will be paid by all who participate in health coverage. . . . [S]uch a mandate would require all . . . to carry health coverage that violates the deeply-held moral and religious convictions of many.”

A petition will be available after all weekend Masses to oppose this mandate. Please consider signing your name to this worthy cause.

This Saturday, September 24th, the Feast of Our Lady of Mercy, there will be Holy Mass at **8:30 am** in **St Lambert Church** in the presence of the Missionary Image of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Music 'Notes'

"The pipe organ is to be held in high esteem in the Latin Church, since it is its traditional instrument, the sound of which can add a wonderful splendor to the Church's ceremonies and powerfully lift up men's minds to God and higher things." -From the Second Vatican Council, *Musicam Sacram*

In reading the decrees of Vatican II, we are once again reminded of the high place the organ possesses in the history and current liturgy of our Catholic faith. You will notice that we will be increasing the use of the organ here at St. Lambert and, though it is not a pipe organ, the electronic organ we have can, in many cases, be made sufficient.

In his 1903 *Instruction on Sacred Music*, Pope St. Pius X wrote highly about the organ but also warned: "As the singing should always have the principal place, the organ or other instruments should merely sustain and never oppress it." Please be patient! I have played the organ at many parishes, but am new to this particular instrument. An electronic organ is harder to gauge than a pipe organ, as it is impossible to tell how loud it sounds in the back of church versus the front. But you have my assurance: I will never seek to overpower the congregation for some kind of vain glory; it will just take some time to learn what works and what doesn't. Thank you!

Also, we are beginning our transition to the new translation of the Mass by introducing the sung parts. You will find the music on card-stock at the ends of the pews. There will be several Mass settings we will learn over the upcoming year; the first is a simple and reverent setting by Dom Gregory Murray.
